

STREETS COMMITTEE MINUTES
JULY 5, 2017

The Streets Committee meeting was held on July 5, 2017 at North Royalton City Hall, 14600 State Road. The meeting was called to order at 6:10 p.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Moved by Mr. Antoskiewicz, seconded by Mr. Nickell to **approve the June 6, 2017 Streets Committee minutes**. Roll Call: Yeas: 3. Nays: 0. **Motion carried.**

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. **Issue 1 Funding**
No update.

2. **North Royalton Alternative Transportation Study**

Mr. Schmitzer reported that the Engineering Department is working with the Service Department to put the plan together for the sidewalk we received grant money for. He said that the city's portion is to pay for the storm sewer work. We may do this in house or we may sub it out. Once this is done it will be prepped for the sidewalks and the decision will be made if this work will be done in house or subbed out. The plan is to do this work this year, fall at the latest. Mr. Kasaris asked if the funds will come out the Wastewater budget for the city's portion of this project. Mr. Dean said that traditionally it has not been done this way for sidewalks, but an argument could be used that it is a reasonable use of an improvement to wastewater. Mr. Kasaris said that we are using storm water employees who are paid out of wastewater funds, it would seem to him that if we are piping in something related to storm water, this should also come out of wastewater funds. Mr. Schmitzer said that he is not certain where they are coming from. We have the money from the sewer district that is coming back to us and he feels that would be an appropriate use of those funds. He said that it is a minimal amount of money for the pipe work if we do it in house. There will be more of an expense if it is bid out.

3. **Service Department Report**

A copy of the report is attached to these minutes. Mr. Nickell asked if there has been any resolution to the York Road trench by the new apartments. Mr. Cinquepalmi said it is being watched and they are keeping the road passable. No permanent repair will be made yet since the dirt is still settling.

4. **2016 Infrastructure Program**

Mr. Schmitzer said that there are a few minor items on the 2015 road program we still need to follow up on with the contractor. He said that they will have Karvo come back and mill off the lane and redo it at the west end of Hawley Drive where there are some storm water issues. We will have them fix the other minor, nonstructural items at that time as well. He said that the warranty on the work expires in December. There are no outstanding items pertaining to the 2016 road program.

5. **2017 Infrastructure Program**

Mr. Schmitzer said that the bid opening was held a few weeks ago for Tilby and the bid was accepted by Council for Specialized Construction. The bid opening for Parkdale and Royalhaven was held this morning. He said that there was only one bidder and that was Specialized Construction. He said that if this bid is accepted, he will talk to the contractor about backing out some costs since the same contractor is already on site. For example, he is not going to pay for mobilization of both projects since they are already here. Traffic maintenance is another area where we can realize some additional savings. He felt that this

would bring the cost from \$450,000 to just under \$400,000. He felt that doing all of these roads for under \$900,000 is a very good deal for the city. Mr. Nickell said that 4 houses down on the east side of Parkdale there is a significant ditch that draws all of the water out from the woods. He asked if the Service Department could clean that out before we do the road, or is this part of the project bid. Mr. Schmitzer said that he would like to take a look at it first and see if we can use our staff to jet the sewer to minimize the amount of effort needed but not minimizing the problem. This is not part of the project bid. Mr. Antoskiewicz said that the legislation to accept the bids for this project is on Council's agenda tonight with blanks for the contractor and cost. If we determine to move forward this evening, we will need to amend the legislation to fill in those blanks. Mr. Nickell asked if the alternate bid does the single pass which is better but also more expensive. Mr. Schmitzer said yes. He said that the base bid is always a mill and fill and the alternate is for a single pass. He said that the single pass option makes for a better road down the line. Discussion on the two processes ensued. Mr. Antoskiewicz asked if this amount fits in with what was budgeted for road repairs. Mr. Dean said yes. Due to the salt savings we had and savings in a few other areas as well we were able to budget enough for these projects.

Moved by Mr. Nickell, seconded by Mr. Antoskiewicz to **recommend that Council accept the alternate bid for Parkdale and Royalhaven**. Roll Call: Yeas: 3. Nays: 0. **Motion carried.**
