

**STORM WATER COMMITTEE MINUTES
JULY 3, 2018**

The Storm Water Committee meeting was held on July 3, 2018 at North Royalton City Hall, 14600 State Road. The meeting was called to order at 6:02 p.m.

2. **Maintenance Projects**

Mr. Schmitzer reported that the 3 year warranty for the Cedar Estates Storm Sewer project is expiring on July 28, 2018. He said that there are a few outstanding small punch list items that need to be addressed and he has emailed the contractor to try to schedule a meeting within the next few weeks to go out and get these items addressed so that we can close out the project. Mr. Schmitzer said that he sent an email to DiGioia Suburban who did the Cedar Estates Basin project asking to meet with them to go over the punch list for this project. Mr. Schmitzer said that they have been working with the sewer district, West Creek, Soil and Water and some other agencies regarding the creek on Tilby Road by the Jencson property and trying to look for some funding sources to help with this project. He said that it is a busy time of year for all of these agencies so trying to get them all in the same room is tough, but we are keeping at it and are hoping to have some more dialog next week with the sewer district. He is trying to get this funded as part of the regional funding. He said that this is a lengthy process. He said that he sent Mr. Jencson an update this afternoon.

John Jencson, 9610 Tilby Road addressed the committee. He said that he appreciated the update he received. He wants to stress that it has been since 9-29-2016 that this has been going on. He understands that there is a lot that has to come together for this to happen and said that he appreciates the city's efforts. He said that he has started moving his power lines and has it buried 18 inches deep in anticipation of the creek being moved. He is relocating the bridge as well.

Vivian Luther, 4731 Oakridge Drive addressed the committee. She said that she has a creek situation as well and just learned that it is under the jurisdiction now of the sewer district. She said that they have severe erosion problems. She said that thanks to the Mayor there were some gabion baskets put in a number of years ago, but now the creek overflows when it rains. She said that about 4 years ago she had to rescue a woman whose car was flooded. This car could have gone over and into the creek. The police came but even they couldn't reach her because there is a dip in the road and when the water comes up over the road it is very deep. She said that it happened again this year and her neighbors block off the road so that people don't drive down there. She felt that there was a huge liability for the city if someone dies in this situation. She said that what is happening now is that there is so much erosion because the retention basin up near Vista Lane never has any water in it. She does not know why it was placed there. She said that all of the trees along the side of the creek are all being eroded from underneath and are starting to fall. She didn't feel that residents should have to absorb the cost of

having these trees taken down and said that something has to be done. She said that her basement floods repeatedly once the creek rises over the banks. She said that it is a severe danger when the road gets covered. She said that they call all the time to have the police come and block it off from both directions because they really don't want to see someone get hurt. Mr. Nickell asked if the police respond when they call. Ms. Luther said no. Mayor Stefanik said that that the police do come and block it off. He has been down there when the police have blocked it off. Mayor Stefanik said that this area is part of the 21 miles under the jurisdiction of NEORS and he sits on their board and is aware of the problem. Discussion regarding the history of this area ensued. Mayor Stefanik said that it is a good thing that this area is under the jurisdiction of NEORS; otherwise the costs would have to be borne by the residents. He said that he has given Ms. Luther the phone number of who to contact at NEORS and they should come out very shortly after she contacts them.

3. **Turnpike Mitigation**

Mr. Schmitzer said that the plans are being worked on currently for the York Road drainage coming from the turnpike. He said that he will update the Streets Committee on the status of other plans that we have with ODOT.

Crack Sealing-continue on Drake Rd.
Storm Water-start catch basin work on Bennett Rd. by Police & Fire departments.

Asphalt-Swan Lake, grind out strips and install new asphalt.
Storm Water-finish basins on Bennett Rd.

6/7/18-Thur.
