

## **STREETS COMMITTEE MINUTES**

### **MAY 2, 2017**

The Streets Committee meeting was held on May 2, 2017 at North Royalton City Hall, 14600 State Road. The meeting was called to order at 6:06 p.m.

### **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

Moved by Mr. Nickell, seconded by Mr. Antoskiewicz to **approve the April 4, 2017 Streets Committee minutes**. Roll Call: Yeas: 3. Nays: 0. **Motion carried.**

### **UNFINISHED BUSINESS**

#### **1. Issue 1 Funding**

Mayor Stefanik said that on May 4, 2017 the Issue 1 Committee will be meeting to discuss more about the methodology on how they score the projects and which projects get scoring. The past few years they have been leaning towards sewer and water projects and he said that the consensus of a lot of the Mayors are they want to get back to road projects. With the way that the infrastructure is falling apart in the region, the communities could certainly use more money for road projects. The applications for funding will be coming out on August 5, 2017 and there will be workshops in August that our Engineering Department always attend. The application deadline is September 23, 2017. The final decision regarding how they will be ranking the projects will determine which projects we will be submitting for the upcoming year.

#### **2. North Royalton Alternative Transportation Study**

Mayor Stefanik said that on April 14, 2017 our application was up before the NOACA Planning and Programming Committee and was recommended for approval. The Executive Committee meets on May 12, 2017 to vote on the project and then it would be up to the entire NOACA Board to approve it on June 9, 2017. We would receive \$107,000 for sidewalks between City Hall and Rt. 82, including a local match which will be the storm water work we will perform in front of one of the properties. He said that he will have more information by the next committee meeting. Mayor Stefanik said that this area receives a lot of traffic coming from the school through Memorial Park up to Rt. 82 so he thinks that they realize that it is a high traffic area and is worthy of consideration. Mr. Antoskiewicz said that we have gone back and forth over sidewalks for the last few years and this is another example of just being persistent. He said that Rome wasn't built in a day and this community is 199 years old. It is going to take time to get sidewalks throughout the city and with Council and the Administration's approach of trying to incorporate sidewalks into any new road projects, we will get this accomplished. We just need to be patient and anytime that we can do this without having to charge the residents it's a good deal.

#### **3. Service Department Report**

Mr. Cinquepalmi reviewed the report, a copy of which is attached to these minutes. Mr. Cinquepalmi gave an update on the Ridge Road/Cady Road project and said that they have started the catch basin grant program last week and the crack sealing program will start this week.

Mrs. Hannan asked if Mr. Cinquepalmi wished to comment on the legislation on this evening's Council agenda. Mr. Cinquepalmi asked for approval for the salt consortium bid with Cargill and for the asphalt consortium bid with Kokosing. Mr. Antoskiewicz asked if we have left over salt from last year and asked if this price is higher than last year. Mr. Cinquepalmi said that last year we were at \$56.00 and the new price will be \$52.29. He said we have about 2,500 tons of salt still on hand going into next year. We have used almost half of what we normally use over the last two years. Mr. Nickell asked if there was still salt

stored in the second building. Mr. Cinquepalmi said no, we wanted to empty that building, clean it up and make it free and clear for storage use.

Moved by Mr. Nickell, seconded by Mr. Antoskiewicz to **recommend approval of Ordinances 17-61 and 17-62 to Council**. Roll Call: Yeas: 3. Nays: 0. **Motion carried.**

4. **2016 Infrastructure Program**

Mr. Schmitzer said that we are still finishing up the 2015 program because it ran so long. We have had some calls from residents regarding some rutting that has occurred due to recent rains. We have sent this information to Karvo and will be meeting with them so that they can come out and address all these issues at one time.

**NEW BUSINESS**

1. **2017 Infrastructure Program**

Mr. Schmitzer reported that we are in the process of putting the bid books together for the Tilby Road program. He anticipates that within 10 days we will be out to bid. He said that most likely we will have legislation on Council's agenda for the first meeting in June to accept the lowest and best bidder. Mr. Nickell asked if there will be much work to the side ditches. Mr. Schmitzer said that we are just doing the road and getting that taken care of. He said that the ditches could be a project all by themselves, but we will do what we can. We have considered some asphalt run offs so it doesn't erode the side and gets the water into the ditch.

4/3/17-MON.

Saw Cutting-sent a crew to Ridge Rd. to cut three driveway aprons [future culvert replacement].  
Patching-checking mains & secondary's.  
Catch Basins-continue to rebuild the basins on W130th.  
Storm Water Maintenance-checking and cleaning our storm structures [on and off rain all week].

4/4/17-TUES.

Patching-finish up on our secondary's and move into the developments.  
Catch Basins-finish rebuilding the basins on W130th. And set up for Wednesday pour.  
Storm Water-Vac. Truck cleaning and jetting the basins on Harrow Pl.

4/5/17-WEDS.

Patching-the back of Oakridge & part of the Planets.  
Concrete- poured the repaired basins on W130th.  
Tree Trimming-finish up on Mercury Dr. [this completes our work in the Planets].

4/6/17-THUR.

Ditching-W130th. Cleaned three ditches where slit has built up and is holding the water back [12359, 12387 and 12397].  
Tree Trimming-11067 Donmar Rd. cleared brush & small trees away from the side road.  
Garage-set up and load salt trucks [over night snow, last hit of snow hopefully].

4/7/17-FRI.

Plowing-All Trucks are out including pick-ups & one tons for cul-de-sacs, [the 2"to 3" turned into 7"to 8"]

4/10/17-MON.

Storm Water-Donmar Rd. we are checking a storm line with our camera to see if it's the resident's or our line that is blocked. After checking it is the resident's responsibility. After we finished on Donmar we went to 11706 State Rd with the Vac. Truck to jet out the storm line. We got half way through the line and the truck broke down, it will take two days to fix.  
Mailboxes-with the heavy snow Friday quite a few boxes were damaged. We will be fixing them for the next few days.  
Patching-checking & repairing any potholes we incur.

4/11/17 TUES.

Ditching-11067 Donmar Rd. redefining the ditch after the new road and cul-de sac were done.  
Mailboxes-continue to repair boxes.  
Patching-continue our patching throughout the city.

4/12/17-WEDS.

Storm Water- We returned to finish jetting the storm line at 11706 State Rd.  
Patching-We did joint repair on Pine Hill ct. and Greenwood Ov.  
Mailboxes-continue to repair boxes.

4/13/17-THUR.

Old City Hall- Landscape the tree lawn in front Ridge Rd. from Bennett to Rt82. And in front of Rt82 from Ridge Rd. to the fire department.
