

STORM WATER COMMITTEE MINUTES
APRIL 1, 2014

The Storm Water Committee meeting was held on April 1, 2014 at North Royalton City Hall, 13834 Ridge Road. The meeting was called to order at 6:20 p.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. **Storm Water/Infrastructure Maintenance Monthly Report**

Mr. Cinquepalmi asked if anyone had any questions on the monthly report. Mr. Kasaris asked what the problem was at 10124 Hardwood Trail. Mr. Cinquepalmi said that they don't yet know. It is a plastic storm line. Wastewater is going to camera the sanitary line for us. We made the repair on the storm line last year. Mr. Nickell asked about 8950 Abbey Road. Mr. Cinquepalmi reviewed the items on the report regarding 8950 Abbey Road and said that now that this work is done, landscaping will be done when the weather permits.

2. **2014 Projects**

Mr. Schmitzer said that there is a meeting for Cedar Estates tomorrow morning with the consultant and ODNR personnel to review the project and make our recommendations of what we want to do and to make sure it fits in line with the permit process discussed at the last meeting. After this meeting, we will determine if what we saw in the field is going to change their position on permitting. He said that he is pretty confident based on discussions he has had with them and with what they have seen. After everything is confirmed, we can start getting all of the permits lined up. Project is still scheduled to go out this year.

Mr. Kasaris asked if there was any update on the Hoffman property on Boston Road. Mr. Schmitzer said the last update he received was a few months ago where the developer has found a unique solution to not meet mitigation for their project, so that site is no longer being looked at as a mitigation area. He said that we still have West Creek, and Soil and Water is looking at other projects to see where they might need mitigation. Mr. Schmitzer said that the work the city did on the property by moving what was under the bridge said placing it there seems to have held up pretty well.

3. **Hawley/Delsy/Lynn/Beechwood creek erosion and maintenance**

Mayor Stefanik said work will begin this year at the 90 degree angle of the creek.

4. **Turnpike Mitigation**

Mr. Schmitzer said that he received an email from the committee that asked us to rank the projects in order of priority. He said we had 4 projects and he ranked them based on cost since it will be easier to get the lower dollar amounts. The first ranked project is the York Road ball fields then the new ball field located on county property, the Edgerton Road flood plain area and then the sound barriers on North Akins. He said that the committee did not say that ranking the projects means that we are going to receive funding. They are simply moving the process along to get to a point where they will decide funding. Mr. Schmitzer said he would advise Council as soon as he hears something. Tom Rantaner asked for an explanation of the program. Mr. Schmitzer explained that the Ohio Turnpike in cooperation with ODOT sets aside funds in the amount of \$5 million on an annual basis to help mitigate items that are related to problems caused by the turnpike. He said that the parameters are very broad and general and we can

apply for projects within a mile of the turnpike. He said that our four projects total between \$2.5-\$2.75 million. Each project is limited to a maximum of \$1 million.

NEW BUSINESS

- March 28th – 8950 Abbey Rd – Installed 60' of 30" ADS pipe connected 6" storm line and installed a
clean out, backfilled and graded
- March 31st – 8950 Abbey Rd – Excavate and install 12' of 30" ADS pipe and installed gabion baskets
for 6' x 3' headwall
