

**UTILITIES COMMITTEE MINUTES
MAY 5, 2015**

The Utilities Committee meeting was held on May 5, 2015 at North Royalton City Hall, 14600 State Road. The meeting was called to order at 6:01 p.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Moved by Mr. Kasaris, seconded by Mr. Langshaw to **approve the April 7, 2015 minutes.** Yeas: 3. Nays: 0.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Inflow/Infiltration of storm water.

Mr. Tigue said that they began dye testing the week of April 20, 2015. They are currently working on Ridge Road and have done 17 homes so far, of which only 2 failed. He said they have 10 more to do on Ridge Road. Mr. Antoskiewicz asked what part of Ridge Road they are testing. Mr. Tigue said that these homes were converted to sewer from septic in 2008. He said there are about 27 homes and they are located on the northern section of Ridge Road. Mr. Kasaris asked for a status update on the homes in the St. Thomas Woods area. Mr. Tigue said that 40% of the homes still need to do the repairs and we will be notifying them again. Mr. Kasaris asked how many residents purchased back flow valves. Mr. Tigue said that Padua East had a few. This is the area that backed up the most during the May 12, 2014 storm. Mr. Nickell asked if we currently have any flow meters in place. Mr. Tigue said no, we have pulled them all out. He said the last place we used them was on Pamela Drive and this area will be the next big project after Sprague Road and York Road. Mr. Nickell asked how much of York Road will be worked on. Mr. Tigue said they have another 76 homes on York Road and about 80 homes on Sprague Road. He said Sprague Road will be the toughest street to work on because it is so tight and we will need 4 people performing the work; 2 to do the work and 2 to flag. Mr. Antoskiewicz asked how many houses they can test per day. Mr. Tigue said they just did 17 homes in less than 10 days and that is the fastest they have done due to the fact that there were so few failures. He said if there is a failure, it takes 2-3 hours per home; it is much quicker if there is no failure. He said that there are a lot of homes on Sprague Road and York Road to test so we may not even get to Pamela Drive this year.
