

STORM WATER COMMITTEE MINUTES FEBRUARY 4, 2014

The Storm Water Committee meeting was held on February 4, 2014 at North Royalton City Hall, 13834 Ridge Road. The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Moved by Mr. Nickell, seconded by Mr. Langshaw to **approve the January 7, 2014 minutes**. Yeas: 3. Nays: 0. **Motion carried.**

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Storm Water/Infrastructure Maintenance Monthly Report

Mr. Cinquepalmi reported that the crews have been on snow removal duty due to the weather, but we are going out and doing the projects when we can. We have finished up the school project on Albion Road. We will need to go back in the spring and landscape. Last week we started working on a county storm main on Wallings near Heasley Field. The pipe joints were all gone and there were a lot of sink holes. We are replacing the pipe and will landscape in spring. He said he is hoping to get the rest of the pipe in by next month, weather permitting. The next two projects are 1) Akins Road where we still have to lower three pipes by the CEI towers and; 2) ditch work on State Road, north of Wallings, by replacing some pipes and adding a catch basin to try and resolve the problems there. It is a joint effort between the two homeowners. They are paying for all the materials and we are doing the work and this will solve a messy situation there.

2. 2014 Projects

Mr. Cinquepalmi said that they are going to go back and revisit some of the projects we have done in the past. Abbey Road by Sprague Road will be getting walls with gabions underneath the bridge. We left an access road through the city owned property where they razed the houses so there will be easy access to do some trenching.

Mr. Nickell said that the curb there is really eroded and wondered if there is anything that can be done. Mr. Cinquepalmi said that they will take a look at it and do what we have to do to shore it up.

Applewood and Cedar Estates are also moving forward with planning for 2014. Mayor Stefanik said that we received a statement from the Army Corps of Engineers that we do not need a permit from them for the Cedar Estates project, so that will speed up the process. The consultant is still waiting for feedback about the wetland disturbances but still anticipates that we will be advertizing for bids in late spring, early summer. He said that he is hopeful to be able to get additional information to the residents by next month.

3. Hawley/Delsy/Lynn/Beechwood creek erosion and maintenance

Mayor Stefanik said we are going to be doing something with the erosion around the 90 degree bend. We expect that to happen once the weather breaks and we can assess what needs to be done.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Turnpike Mitigation

Mayor Stefanik said we have submitted 4 projects for the money earmarked by the Turnpike for mitigation. There is \$5 million/year available and many other communities have applied as well. The projects are: miscellaneous ditching and drainage near York and Bennett Roads; Edgerton Road Flood plain area; sound barriers for turnpike section on North Akins; the ravine on the new ball field located on county property. Mayor Stefanik said that he will have Dan Collins email Council a summary of the

projects. Mr. Cinquepalmi said we are trying to work in to the ball field project the work that needs to be done on the ball field entrance that crosses over the culvert.

Mr. Antoskiewicz said that the Turnpike has said that the project funding will be for 2015, however they have indicated that “shovel ready” projects such as drainage issues may receive funding this year.
