

**STREETS COMMITTEE MINUTES
FEBRUARY 4, 2014**

The Streets Committee meeting was held on February 7, 2014 at North Royalton City Hall, 13834 Ridge Road. The meeting was called to order at 6:34 p.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. **2014 Road Program**

Mayor Stefanik said that we are going to wait until March or April once the winter thaw is over to assess the overall quality of the roads.

2. **Sprague Road**

Mayor Stefanik said that a proposal will be available soon. They are doing some survey work right now at the Broadview and Sprague Roads intersection to verify compliance of turning radii and pavement widths. We will get 3 quotes on that and then prepare the package to be put out in late spring.

3. **Issue 1 Funding**

4. **Street light for YMCA**

Mayor Stefanik said that the lights have been installed. Mr. Petrusky said that there is an overabundance of street lighting heading west on Wallings Road from Heasley Field to State Road, as well as State Road south compared with the number of streetlights located throughout the city. He suggested maybe moving some of these lights to other areas where there are not as many lights. Mayor Stefanik said that there was probably a reason for this decision, but said that that he would have the traffic unit look into this.

5. **City Sidewalks**

Mayor Stefanik said that the group doing the study has spoken with Mr. Jordan to get some preliminary questions answered and we should have more to report on at the next meeting.

Discussion held regarding installing sidewalks around the new City Hall.

Mayor Stefanik explained that the \$50,000 we are contributing to the Metroparks' all purpose trail is coming out of the Future Capital Improvement Fund. Brecksville and Broadview Hts. are contributing \$100,000 each. Our share is less since we have already partnered with the Metroparks on the Aukerman Park in the amount of \$180,000, which is adjacent to the all purpose trail. The Metroparks have stated that if they get the grant, they are looking at having the trail completed by the end of next year.

MISCELLANEOUS

Mayor Stefanik said that we are going to have to revisit the budget at the end of March regarding salt and overtime for the Service Department. Mr. Cinquepalmi said that we have plenty of salt and access to more when needed. Mr. Cinquepalmi said that we have been able to keep the trucks in good working order in between storms. Mr. Cinquepalmi gave a review of the snow plowing regimen the city follows in order to keep the streets passable.

Mayor Stefanik said that there have been some water main breaks around the city. The break on Titan Drive was fixed on Friday and they were out on Edgerton Road trying to get that one fixed. After that they were going to go to Akins Road. Since then we have had a break on Rt. 82, and another at Sprague and State Road Intersection. Cleveland Water is working on these, as well as numerous breaks in other cities, on a priority basis.

Mr. Muller said that a resident contacted him with concerns over the sufficiency of the guard rail at Edgerton Road and the parkway. Their concern was if this was sufficient protection for the kids sledding on the hill. Mayor Stefanik said that there has never been an issue to his knowledge.
