

STREETS COMMITTEE MINUTES
JUNE 6, 2017

The Streets Committee meeting was held on June 6, 2017 at North Royalton City Hall, 14600 State Road. The meeting was called to order at 6:18 p.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Moved by Mr. Antoskiewicz, seconded by Mr. Nickell to **approve the May 2, 2017 Streets Committee minutes**. Roll Call: Yeas: 3. Nays: 0. **Motion carried.**

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Issue 1 Funding

No update.

2. North Royalton Alternative Transportation Study

Mayor Stefanik said that NOACA is voting on Friday on the grant that we applied for. It has so far passed through the first two committees and if it is approved on Friday we will receive \$100,000 to use for sidewalks from City Hall north to Rt. 82. He said that the city's contribution will be to pipe in the section across from Swan Lake. Mrs. Hannan asked when the project is expected to start. Mayor Stefanik said that will be up to the city but hopefully we can get it started this year.

3. Service Department Report

Mr. Cinquepalmi reviewed the report, a copy of which is attached to these minutes. He said that the street striping is expected to start as early as next weekend and will be completed by the time school starts. Mr. Cinquepalmi said that the report on rubbish collections usually comes mid-month so we will be able to report on it next month. Mr. Cinquepalmi said that it was a pretty smooth transition and whatever reservations residents had before the program started seems to have gone away. It has been very quiet. Mr. Antoskiewicz asked how many exemptions to the recycling program have been issued due to medical considerations. Mr. Cinquepalmi said that the Law Department created a questionnaire that a resident fills out and then he reviews it for necessity. He said that we only have 4 exemptions for the entire city.

4. 2016 Infrastructure Program

Mr. Schmitzer said that Karvo did some restoration work along Abbey Road. There might be one or two little things left to do but we will get to those in the fall.

5. 2017 Infrastructure Program

Mr. Schmitzer said that they had the bid opening for the 2017 asphalt overlay program for Tilby Road. There were 5 bidders and Specialized Construction was the lowest bidder on both the base and alternate bids. The difference between these bids was a mill and fill vs. single pass process. He said that the single pass process seems to provide a better product. The additional \$75,000 for the alternate bid was still under our original estimate and he feels that this is the best way to go for this project. He said that the legislation is on tonight's Council agenda and asked the committee for their recommendation to accept this bid. Mr. Kasaris asked how much the engineer's estimate was. Mr. Schmitzer said it was \$636,000 for the base and \$673,000 for the alternate. Mr. Schmitzer said that they have allowed for extra costs in case we discover any base repairs that we are unaware of. Mr. Nickell asked if they are taking core samples to ensure that the base is good. Mr. Schmitzer said that with the single pass process, they will pull a minimum of ten samples from the pavement so that we can analyze the thickness and makeup of the materials so that we can set up a formula for how much emulsion and cyclogen we are going to inject into the pavement when we recycle it to ensure that we are hitting the strength numbers that we need to hit.

Moved by Mr. Nickell, seconded by Mr. Antoskiewicz **to recommend Ordinance 17-78 to Council for approval.** Roll Call: Yeas: 3. Nays: 0. **Motion carried.**

NEW BUSINESS

Mayor Stefanik said now that the bids for Tilby Road have come in under the original estimate we have the opportunity to add Royalhaven Drive and Parkdale Drive to the 2017 program. The authorization to bid is on Council's agenda this evening. The committee was in agreement of proceeding in this matter.

Mayor Stefanik said that we have heard from ODOT regarding some of the major projects that they will be doing in North Royalton. He said that they will be going out to bid for Rt. 82 from York Road to the Broadview Hts. line in January 2019. He said that this is not a widening project; it is a resurfacing. The city's cost will be 20% plus some design costs. Mr. Kasaris asked if this project would benefit from the fabric being placed between the asphalt and the concrete. Mr. Schmitzer said that this was proposed when we did Ridge and State Roads, but it would have been completely at the city's cost, and the state was not in favor of us doing this. Mr. Kasaris asked if the state can prohibit us from doing this. Mr. Schmitzer said no. Mr. Kasaris asked what it would cost us to do this. Mr. Schmitzer said that he would have to look into this. Mr. Kasaris felt that it might be something we want to investigate. Mayor Stefanik said that Ridge Road from Rt. 82 north to Sprague Road is scheduled for 2022. Mr. Nickell said that he understands that we won't get sidewalks included, but encouraged trying to get a wider berm like what was done on State Road. Mr. Schmitzer said that State Road was an exception. We did not anticipate that they were going to do this but he is glad that it was done. It provides extra safety beyond the white line for pedestrians. Mr. Nickell also suggested taking another look at adding the third lane on Rt. 82 where it goes from two lanes to one. Mr. Schmitzer said that ODOT wants to look at the timing of the lights to see if this is contributing to the traffic problem. Mr. Nickell said that he doubts that this is the problem. He feels that it is the slower trucks and busses going up the hill during rush hour. It was just something he wanted to bring up for consideration again. Mayor Stefanik said that we are moving quite a bit of money around for the road program this year and he said that Mr. Dean has sent an explanation of this to Council.

5/1/17-MON.

Asphalt-Joint Repair on York Theta Dr.

Storm Water- 5 Catch Basins on Abbey Rd. between Rt82 and the Turnpike Bridge will be torn out and rebuilt; this is part of the Cuyahoga County reimbursement program.

5/2/17-TUES.

Seminar-sent 10 guys to waste water for training, all day classes.

Landscaping-fixing tree lawns from snow plow damage this past winter.

5/3/17-WEDS.

Asphalt-continue to do our joint repair on York Theta Dr.

Storm Water-continue to work on the catch basins on Abbey Rd.

5/4/17-THUR.

Ditching- on W130th north of Albion Rd.

Asphalt-install strips in front of two new driveways in the morning then split up the crew and sent out on storm maintenance, heavy rains in the forecast.

5/5/17-FRI.

Ditching-4519 Sprague Rd. we also jetted this pipe.

Patching-checked the mains and secondaries.

5/8/17-MON.

Joint Repair-Industrial Parkway, York Theta Dr.

Catch Basins-Abbey Rd. set up and poured two basins. We will asphalt overlay later in the week.

5/9/17-TUES.

Patching-Rt82, Sprague, Bennett and Edgerton.

Storm Water-culvert pipe 6451 Glenwillow Dr.

5/10/17-WEDS.

Joint Repair-continue in the Industrial Parkway.

Storm Water-finish the culvert pipe on Glenwillow. Later this week we will need to repair the road with Asphalt.

Mowing-start cutting around our guardrails.

5/11/17-THUR.

Storm Water-7569 Albion Rd. replaced bad culvert pipe.

Mowing-continue to cut around our guardrails.

Saw cutting-Glenwillow Dr. Saw cut 5 bad areas to be torn out and fixed with hot mix.

5/12/17-FRI.

Mowing-cutting and weed whacking around York & Rt82.

Asphalt-Glenwillow Dr. ripped out three areas, repaired the base and resurfaced with hot mix.

Signs-sent a crew out to straighten signs up.

5/15/17-MON.

Asphalt-continue to rip out sections and repair the base on Glenwillow Dr.

Storm Water-repair catch basins on Abbey, Bunker by Ridge, and the corner of York & Akins.

Mowing-Start cutting retention basins, Helen & Hunting, Jamestown basins.

5/16/17-TUES.

Asphalt- resurfaced catch basins on Abbey and patched north east corner of Akins and York.

Storm Water- Hammered and ripped out catch basins on Stuart court and Oakwood prep for rebuild.

Mowing- Retention Basins- Huntington, Sherwood.

5/17/17-Wed

Asphalt- Joint repair in the Industrial parkway

Storm Water- Rebuild catch basins on Stuart court and Oakwood

Mowing- Retention basin in Chesapeake, Spyglass

Sweeper-Rt 82 west of Abbey to w130, Abbey, Worthington Way.

5/18/17-THUR.

Asphalt-Royalhaven Dr. North of Tilby Rd., patched with hot mix.

Crack Seal-Glenwillow Dr. and York Theta in the Industrial Park.

Storm Water-Catch Basins finished rebuilding and pouring the basins on Stuart ct and Oakwood Dr.

5/19/17-FRI.

Crack Seal- Start Sprague Rd. East of York Rd.

Storm Water-Catch Basins, State and Wallings Rd. 8 basins will be repaired.

5/22/17-MON.

Storm Water-Start repairing the catch basins on York Rd. from Rt82 to Wallings Rd. This along with the repairs done Friday at State & Wallings will be part of the Cuyahoga County reimbursement program.

Asphalt-set up and installed an asphalt strip in front of a new driveway pour on Glenwillow Dr. Then sent the same crew out landscaping all the recent catch basin repairs, the intersection of York & Akins Rd, Abbey, Stuart Ct. and Oakwood Dr.

Crack Sealing-Lytle Rd. and half of Wiltshire Rd.

Storm Water-continue working on York Rd. catch basins.

Street Sweeper-the sweeper will be out for the next few weeks doing the entire city. We will divide the city up similar to our plowing routes. N.W., Central, N.E., S.E, S.W.

5/24/17-WEDS.

Storm Water-continue on York Rd.

Crack sealing-started raining so we sent the crew out patching, Rt82, Maple La. and all of Akins Rd.

Vac. Truck-start cleaning the catch basins on Valley In.

5/25/17-THUR.

Storm Water-8218 Ridgedale replaced bad culvert pipe. Asphalt crew will install the apron tomorrow.

Ditching-9193 York rd. Storm Water will install a new pipe tomorrow.

Vac. Truck-start cleaning catch basins on Vista Dr.

Signs-put up the flags around the city for Memorial Day.

5/26/17-FRI.

Storm Water-installed new pipe at 9193 York Rd. in the morning, then worked on the catch basin on York Rd. across from the Industrial Park.

Asphalt-installed the apron at 8218 Ridgedale in the morning. In the afternoon they installed the apron at 9193 York Rd.

Vac. Truck-finish cleaning the basins on Vista Dr.

Crack Sealing- start on York Rd. south of Rt.82.

Vac. Truck- cleaning out basins on Bennett by the Fire Station, these will be rebuilt at a later date.
