UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Oil Wells

Mayor Stefanik said that there are still a few deficiencies that need to be taken care of by the oil well companies involved. He said that we also wanted clarification about the Zillich well. He said that there is a lot of construction debris stored there and we are trying to get the ODNR to tell us if they are comfortable with this material being there or should it be removed. He said that we are waiting to hear from them. This falls under their jurisdiction and they should be the ones who make this determination. Mr. Langshaw asked if we have heard from Cutter Oil regarding the reimbursement for their spill. Mayor Stefanik said that we gave them 30 days to pay and we were paid on the 30th day.

MISCELLANEOUS

Regarding Ordinance 17-84 which pertains to the EMS Levy, Chief Chegan provided a brief overview of the daily functions of the department and stated that the need for this levy is well justified.

Mr. Petrusky asked for an update on the new truck. Chief Chegan said that we are in the third week of training with the manufacturer and the Ohio Fire Academy. He said that there are basic proficiencies that must be passed on the vehicle including the number of hours behind the wheel, maintenance, and operations. He said that the ladder truck goes in next Monday for the mounting of the equipment and we are hopeful of getting the engine truck the same week. He said that the goal is to have the ladder truck in service by July 10th and the engine truck a week later.

Mr. Langshaw asked for an update on the fire hydrant painting. Chief Chegan said that we are currently in our fifth development and work is continuing to progress.

Mayor Stefanik wished to thank the Police and Fire Departments for doing a great job during the unfortunate situation last week. He said that everyone pitched in and worked together with outside agencies in investigating this matter.
