AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING THE BID OF KOKOSING MATERIALS, INC., FOR THE PURCHASE OF ASPHALT FOR THE 2016 SEASON AS THE LOWEST AND BEST BID, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS: The City of North Royalton is authorized to purchase asphalt through its membership in the Joint Municipal Improvement Consortium (JMIC) which generally occurs at a lower rate than if purchased on the open market; and

WHEREAS: The bids submitted to the JMIC were obtained in compliance with the competitive bidding requirements of the Ohio Revised Code and Charter of the City of North Royalton; and

WHEREAS: The city is purchasing this product at a cost which meets or exceeds the specifications of the Ohio Cooperative Purchasing Program of the Department of Administrative Services, as required by House Bill 204; and

WHEREAS: Council wishes to accept the bid of Kokosing Materials, Inc. for the purchase of asphalt.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1. The 2016 bid of Kokosing Materials, Inc., obtained through the Joint Municipal Improvement Consortium, for asphalt to be supplied to the City of North Royalton, as set forth in Exhibit A and which is in accordance with the specifications on file in the Office of the Service Director, is hereby accepted as the lowest and best bid.

Section 2. The Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract on behalf of the City of North Royalton with Kokosing Materials, Inc., which shall be in accordance to the bid and specifications as set forth in Section 1 hereof, said contract to be in such form as is approved by the Director of Law.

Section 3. The Service Director is hereby authorized and directed to forward a certified copy of this Ordinance to Kokosing Materials, Inc.

Section 4. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 5. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the city, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to provide for the purchase of asphalt for the 2016 season.

THEREFORE, provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, from and after the earliest period allowed by law.



WHEREAS: The 2016 North Royalton Charter Review Commission has determined to provide a ballot issue to require 24 hour advance notice of special meetings to each Council member in place of the 12 hour advance notice currently required; and

WHEREAS: All other meeting notice requirements for the city such as posting, advance notice to media, etc. require 24 hour advance notice, therefore this amendment would bring Article III, Subsection (g) in line with these longer advance notification requirements; and

WHEREAS: In order to provide for the above it is necessary to recommend amending Article III The Council, Subsection (g) Special Meetings, of the Charter of the City of North Royalton; and

WHEREAS: Pursuant to Article XVIII, Subsection (f) of the Charter, the Council is obligated to submit the Charter Review Commission recommendations to the electors.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

The foregoing proposed amendment, if approved by a majority of the electors voting thereon at the aforesaid election to be held on November 8, 2016, shall become a part of the Charter of this city and shall be effective as of the date that said amendment or amendments have been certified by the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections as having been approved by a majority of the voters.

Section 4. The Director of Legislative Services in her capacity as Clerk of Council is hereby authorized and directed to deliver immediately to the Board of Elections a certified copy of this Ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION TO THE ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON A CERTAIN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE XVIII, MISCELLANEOUS, BY CREATING A NEW SUBSECTION (g) ENTITLED DELETION OF OBSOLETE LANGUAGE, REARRANGEMENT OF NUMBERS AND TITLES, AND CORRECTION OF TYPOGRAPHICAL ERRORS, OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON TO ALLOW FOR COUNCIL TO MAKE CERTAIN CORRECTIONS TO THE CHARTER BY ORDINANCE, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS: The 2016 North Royalton Charter Review Commission has determined to provide a ballot issue to allow for the deletion of obsolete language, rearrangement of numbers and titles, and correction of typographical errors by ordinance of Council; and

WHEREAS: No such deletion of obsolete language, or rearrangement of numbers and titles, and correction of typographical errors may be made which affects the substance or meaning of the Charter or any part thereof or amendment thereto; and

WHEREAS: In order to provide for the above it is necessary to recommend amending Article XVIII, Miscellaneous, by creating a new Subsection (g) entitled Deletion of Obsolete Language, Rearrangement of Numbers and Titles, and Correction of Typographical Errors, of the Charter of the City of North Royalton; and

WHEREAS: Pursuant to Article XVIII, Subsection (f) of the Charter, the Council is obligated to submit the Charter Review Commission recommendations to the electors.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1. Pursuant to Article XVIII, Section 9 of the Ohio Constitution and Article XVIII, Subsection €of the Charter of the City of North Royalton, the Council hereby authorizes and directs the submission to the electors of the City of North Royalton, at an election to be held in usual places of voting in said city on November 8, 2016, an amendment to Article XVIII, Miscellaneous, by creating a new Subsection (g) entitled Deletion of Obsolete Language, Rearrangement of Numbers and Titles, and Correction of Typographical Errors which shall upon adoption read as follows:

(g) ***DELETION OF OBSOLETE LANGUAGE, REARRANGEMENT OF NUMBERS AND TITLES, AND CORRECTION OF TYPOGRAPHICAL ERRORS.***

City Council, in consultation with the Director of Law, may by Ordinance do any of the following:

(1) Delete any Charter language that has become obsolete as a result of either the passage of time, an amendment to the Charter, or the preemption of State or Federal law;

(2) Prior to reprinting the Charter upon any adoption by the electorate of any amendment hereto, make such changes to the numbers, titles and arrangement of articles and sections as may be necessary to maintain the logical and consistent ordering of the Charter; and

(3) Correct typographical errors appearing in the Charter.

No such deletion of obsolete language, or rearrangement of numbers and titles, and correction of typographical errors may be made which affects the substance or meaning of this Charter or any part thereof or amendment thereto.
