

**STREETS COMMITTEE MINUTES
MARCH 5, 2019**

The Streets Committee meeting was held on March 5, 2019 at North Royalton City Hall, 14600 State Road. The meeting was called to order at 6:04 p.m.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. North Royalton Alternative Transportation Study

Mr. Schmitzer said that the State Road sidewalk plans are set to bid through ODOT and should be awarded by the end of April. Once this is done, we will receive a work schedule. He said that he met with ODOT on the Bennett Road multi use path. We are getting more information from NOACA on the width and location. It looks like this will be a spring of 2020 project because it will be too late to start work this year. Mr. Antoskiewicz asked if residents in the area have contacted Mr. Schmitzer. Mr. Schmitzer said there has been no contact between the city and the residents yet at this point but we will be in contact once some details have been worked out regarding some of the affected properties.

2. Service Department Report

Mr. Cinquepalmi reviewed this report, a copy of which is attached to these minutes. He said that they will go back to just one shift starting March 17th.

3. 2017 Infrastructure Program. No update.

5. 2018 Infrastructure Program

Mr. Schmitzer said when the weather permits they are going to finish the rehab program on Akins, Gabriella and Delsy. He said that there is still some money in the budget and we are going to see how the roads faired during the winter and do some repairs if necessary before we put the overlay on these roads. Mr. Kasaris asked about an issue on Edgerton Road regarding work we did last year. He said that he received a call from a resident stating that it had deteriorated. Mr. Schmitzer said that he is unaware of this. Mayor Stefanik said that Mr. Cinquepalmi went out to take a look at it. It is a very small hole in the road and it will be taken care of.

6. Rt. 82 Widening Project

Mr. Schmitzer said that they continue to work on the storm sewer. They are done with the water main on the entire road and just need to finish up the hydrants. The water main needs to be tested by Cleveland Water and once they get the OK they will start putting back all the connections to the businesses and residences and will abandon the old 12" main. He said that Columbia Gas is still working on the east end of the project installing the relocated gas lines. Mr. Nickell commented that the striping is pretty thin in places and hard to see and asked if this will be addressed when the weather permits. Mr. Schmitzer said yes, they will make all necessary corrections as the weather allows. A brief discussion on the type of paint used for striping was held. Mr. Antoskiewicz asked where we are with the repaving of Rt. 82. Mr. Schmitzer said that it went out to bid but he has not yet heard the results. He will advise Council once he receives this information.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Cuyahoga County Solid Waste Management Plan presentation

Jessica Fenos of the Cuyahoga County Solid Waste District addressed the Committee regarding their proposed Solid Waste Management Plan and gave a detailed review of the plan. A complete copy of this plan is on file in the City Council Office.
