

STREETS COMMITTEE MINUTES

APRIL 2, 2019

The Streets Committee meeting was held on April 2, 2019 at North Royalton City Hall, 14600 State Road. The meeting was called to order at 6:05 p.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Moved by Mr. Nickell, seconded by Mr. Antoskiewicz to **approve the March 5, 2019 Streets Committee minutes.** Roll Call: Yeas: 2. Nays: 0. **Motion carried.**

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. **North Royalton Alternative Transportation Study**

Mr. Schmitzer said that the State Road sidewalk project will go out to bid this month through ODOT. Construction will begin sometime this year and he should have more information once the bids are completed. He said that they are working on some different design alternatives for the Bennett Road pathway after meeting with NOACA and ODOT. Once these entities agree on the design alternatives we will then move forward with the final plans. Mayor Stefanik said that we also received another grant from NOACA to fund the sidewalk on State Road from City Hall south to Akins Road.

2. **Service Department Report**

Mr. Cinquepalmi reviewed the report, a copy of which is attached to these minutes. In addition, Mayor Stefanik provided a list of streets that will be worked on in 2019. Mr. Cinquepalmi reviewed this list, a copy of this document is attached to these minutes. Mr. Cinquepalmi said that the Service Department will be doing patching on Abbey Road from Albion Road south to Rt. 82. They will be working on Albion as well. He said that they will also be doing some concrete developments. Mr. Petrusky asked if Crossroads is going to go back and fix Elaine Drive, Helen Drive, Perl Court where all the joint repairs are falling apart. Mr. Cinquepalmi said yes. He said that we increased the mill this year from 2 inches to 3 inches. Crossroads is going to go back and do every development that they did last year, seal everything off and if asphalt needs to be removed, they will remove it and re-crack seal everything from last year. Mr. Cinquepalmi said that they are even going back to re-crack seal the work they did in 2017. They are standing behind their work. Mr. Langshaw asked where they will be working on Albion Road. Mayor Stefanik said they will be working where the dips are. General discussion on 2018 repairs was held. Mr. Nickell asked what work is being done with the dips on Albion. Mr. Cinquepalmi said it is the tire lane. The berms and ditches are so close to the road that the weight of truck and vehicle traffic causes it to get squeezed into the ditch. He said that we have to mill it out and put in a thick layer of asphalt for support. Discussion on the mill and fill process ensued.

Helmut Lotz, 10662 Albion Road, addressed the committee. He said that the berm on Albion Road at the lowest level where the ditch enters into the Biro ditch is being washed away. He said that this is at least the third time he is asking the city to address this issue. He said that the driveways are being washed away from rain water flowing east to west. He said that the culvert at the end of his driveway is where his mailbox is located and the Post Office has expressed concerns that the right front wheel of the delivery truck will slip off into the culvert while delivering his mail. He said that both the east and west sides of the driveway culvert are being washed away. Mrs. Hannan asked Mr. Lotz when he last spoke with the Service Department. Mr. Lotz said about two weeks ago. Mr. Nickell asked if we could extend the pipe past his mailbox. This would help Mr. Lotz and the roadway as well. Mayor Stefanik said that we are going to take a look at this and this is part of the Albion Road repairs we are talking about doing this year.

Mayor Stefanik said that that the mail delivery trucks are probably the largest reason that our roads are in such bad shape because they constantly drive on the dirt berms and they have no regard for the roads. They constantly drive on the shoulder and push the dirt up and this is what causes the water to get underneath the roads. They are absolutely irresponsible and this is a problem that we have to deal with.

5. **2018 Infrastructure Program**

Mr. Schmitzer said that he spoke with the contractor and weather permitting they will be back out on April 29th to start doing the one-inch leveling course on the roads. We have a few punch list items that we want them to address as well as over on S. Akins. Mayor Stefanik told Mrs. Hannan that this work will include the driveway she had previously inquired about.

6. **Rt. 82 Widening Project**

Mr. Schmitzer said that the water main work is completed. The first chlorination sample test passed and the second sample was taken today and that testing will take about a week. If this sample also passes they will energize the watermain line and start making all of the tap-ins for the businesses. He said that the phase one storm sewer work is about 95% complete and this work should be finished by the end of April. He said that there is a lot of dirt work that needs to be done because we are raising the grade in a lot of areas. They are preparing for this work on the south side of Rt. 82. April 19th and April 22nd are the tentative dates to start driving the steel H-Pile beams for the retaining wall that are by the bus garage facility. This may be a pinch point for traffic during the day from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. as it will be one lane traffic only because of the large crane required to pound these beams into the ground. He said that the culvert by the bus garage will also have restrictions. As they pour the top of the culvert that is under the road, the pumper truck needs to be on both sides. This should only be a one day restriction and we will try to get this coordinated with the other project. He said that once the dirt work on Phase 1 is finished, which is from the apartments up to the Service Center, they will work to fill in all the trenches in Phase 2 that have been cut open for the water main and storm sewers. Their goal is to switch traffic in Phase 2 back to the two lanes so that we have wider, normal lanes again for the remainder of the year.

NEW BUSINESS

Mr. Schmitzer said that ODOT bid out the Royalton Road resurfacing from York Road to the east corporation line. The best bid came in about \$200,000 under estimate. He said that he will be attending a preconstruction meeting on April 9, 2019 and will share information as he receives it.

ADJOURNMENT

Moved by Mr. Nickell, seconded by Mr. Antoskiewicz to **adjourn the Streets Committee meeting of April 2, 2019**. Roll Call: Yeas: 3. Nays: 0. **Motion carried.**

Remove guardrails in Indian Trails.

Bunker Rd.-fill void under the road from a water main break.

Paint the wash room and the floor.

Tree Trimming-State Rd.

Storm Water-fill sinkhole on Bunker Rd. [from a water main break].

Stack Salt-two days of deliveries to fill the barn.

3/22/19-Fri.

Patching-Ridge Rd., Maple Ln. and Bunker Rd.

Storm Water-repair storm line at the other end of Wiltshire 3800 block.

Catch Basins-continue tuck pointing in Hunters Creek, we should be able to return to Cedarwood Monday, the plant is going to open early next week.

3/25/19-Mon.

Landscaping-Ivy Ov., Lynn Dr., Woodridge. River Oaks.

Storm Water-Return to Cedarwood to tear out basins, [the plant is going to open this week].

Signs-Straightened signage throughout the city.

3/26/19-Tue.

Patching-Abbey Rd. and started on Royal Valley Dr.

Storm Water-finish rebuilding two basins in Cedarwood, it's set up for Thursday pour.

Stuart Ct.-start working on the manhole in the center of the cul-de-sac, needs to be rebuilt.

3/27/19-Wed.

Patching-continue on Royal Valley Dr.

Storm Water-Hunters Creek.

Catch Basins-Villa Grande repair 6 catch basins.

3/28/19-Thur.

Patching-finish Royal Valley.

Storm water-pour catch basins on Cedarwood Dr. Then moved back to Hunters Creek.

Catch Basins-continue on Villa Grande.

3/29/19-Fri.

Storm Water Maintenance-checked and cleaned our storm structures [rain for the next few days].

Catch Basins-continue on Villa Grande. Also sent the other crew to Hunters creek.
