- 2) Answer questions, or make referrals
- 3) Set-up database of names, concerns, places
- 4) Go on site visits
- 5) Follow up —to confirm actions have been taken
- 6) Document bad actors— flag in database

# Recommended for Home and/or Property owners:

- 1) Document all calls, paraphrase conversations
- 2) Take photographs if possible
- 3) Go on site visits
- 4) Consider sending certified mail; requires signature of recipient
